Important Guidelines to all Amadeus Subscribers

It has come to our attention that some travel agency customers have recently been contacted by phone, e-mail or other means such as phishing in order to gain access to their Amadeus system credentials. This has included requests sent via e-mail with links to a fake Amadeus website requesting recipients to provide their Amadeus sign, password and IATA number.

We recommend that customers take the following precautions in such cases:

- Do not open e-mails, e-mail attachments or click on links provided in e-mails from unknown senders
- Contact your local Amadeus representative if you receive suspicious communications of this kind
- Be vigilant and take every possible measure to put in place strong signs and passwords and keep them in a safe place
- Never reveal your Amadeus system credentials such as sign or password or any other confidential information to third parties. Amadeus will never request you to provide information of this kind.
